Sports Premium Spending (2016/17) at Banks Road Infant and Nursery school

Our PE and Sports funding allocation for the academic year 2016 to 2017 was £8600.

At Banks Road we are used our Sports Premium funding in a variety of ways to:

- · develop teaching and learning in PE
- give children the opportunity to experience a range of sports
- · promote healthy and active lifestyles
- enable children to participate in competitive sport.

Priorities and Actions for 2016/17

- 1. Employ specialist sports coaches from Major Oak sports coaching company to teach 1 Key Stage 1 PE lesson per week.
- 2. Purchase / develop resources needed in order to deliver a range of sports across Key Stage 1
- 3. Purchase / develop resources needed in order to promote physical development and active play outdoors.
- 4. Continue to raise the profile of an active and healthy lifestyle within our school.
- 5. Provide opportunities for children to participate in additional competitions.

Action Plan

In order to achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in our school, we invest a large proportion of our Sports Premium funding on Major Oak sports coaches. They work with class teachers and teaching assistants to deliver a range of sports and fundamentals multi skills programmes which engage the children and provide a high quality model for teachers to use in their taught PE lessons.
