PARENT HELPERS

We welcome and encourage parent helpers into school on a regular basis, as it adds much needed support for the children. From the start of the pandemic we have been unable to facilitate helpers in school due to the school's risk assessment but we would now like to open our doors once more!

We regard all our helpers in school as part of the Banks Road Team and have a professional duty to you in this capacity. We now have a policy in school for all volunteers / visitors and parent helpers. As part of the process of welcoming your invaluable contribution to the learning of our children, we are hold an 'induction' which will include: our aims and values, confidentiality, supervision, health and safety (including current Covid-19 safety measures in place) and safeguarding. All 'new' volunteers in school will be required to attend this induction meeting led by myself, Mrs Clemens, before they are able to volunteer in school. If you have already attended this induction at any time that your child has been at Banks Road, you are not required to attend again.

There will only be 2 induction meetings for this year. If you think you will be able to help at any point during the course of your child's time at Banks Road (including off-site visits) you will have to attend one of these meetings. The dates are Wednesday 29th September at 6.15 p.m and Thursday 30th September at 9 a.m. Please notify the office if you would like to attend one of these meetings.

Your help is always greatly appreciated and we hope that you will gain much from your experiences. We welcome grandparents and parents and carers too! Thank you for your continued support.

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ATTENDANCE

Schools are unable to authorise any holiday during term time (unless for an exceptional circumstance). Please visit our website

If your child has a minor cough or cold and you are in two minds whether to send them to school, please send them in and we will ring you if they feel unwell during the school day. Children should not be absent from school if they have head lice. This needs to be treated appropriately and then they may attend school normally.

If your child has a sickness bug please be aware that school policy remains at 48 hours from the last bout of sickness before they can return to school.

This remains a strong focus for us and it is important that your child attends school every day so that they don't miss out on valuable learning. Good attendance is crucial in ensuring your child makes good progress both academically and socially.

Please ensure you inform us if your child is unwell. The office opens at 8.00am each morning, or alternatively, please leave a message. Children arriving after the completion of the register are deemed to be late and this is recorded separately.

- Arrivals after 8.50 a.m. must be signed in by the parents.
- Arrivals between 8.50 a.m. and 9.00 a.m. will be recorded as late before the register closes.
- Arrivals after 9.00 a.m. will be recorded as late after the register closes.
- The number of minutes late will be recorded and monitored and reported to parents

We acknowledge that each family's circumstances are different but our school is dedicated to the education of all our pupils and believes that regular attendance throughout the year is essential to every child's success and fulfilment.



BEHAVIOUR

Next week in school is 'values' week when we will celebrate our BRILLIANT expectations in action and celebrate how awesome Banks Road children are. We will discussing how we can improve our school and our school council will have a key role in these school developments. We are, therefore, looking to vote on our class councillors and will be asking children in year 1 and year 2 to present why they are a suitable candidate. Children will need to video themselves completing a small speech explaining what strengths they can bring to school council. This needs to be completed at home and uploaded onto the child's class dojo portfolio by Monday 13 September. Mrs Moore is sharing more details on class dojo. (Reception school councillors will be voted later on in the term. To enable them to settle into school!)

It takes the dedication of everyone involved using many techniques and a consistent approach from the whole staff team and the support of our parents, so please remind yourselves of our school Behaviour Policy and further information on our practices by looking on the school website under 'Our School/Behaviour at Banks Road'.

Our annual Home/School agreement will also be coming home soon in your child's bag. Please take the time to talk through this with your child and send back the reply slip to school.

DINNERS / SANDWICHES

We continue to allow children to have a mixture of sandwiches and dinners. If your child has specific dietary requirements these must be discussed with the school cook. FRIENDS ASSOCIATION

The *Friends* is the PTA group for Banks Road Infant & Nursery School. They are a registered charity, run entirely by volunteer parents & representatives of the teaching staff. Their aim is to raise funds for the school and nursery to provide extra items not covered by the school's budget, as well as arranging a wide variety of fun social events throughout the school year for the severely impacted during the pandemic due to lost generated income through our breakfast, after school and holidays clubs being cancelled and the extra costs of supply staff due to staff required to isolate. It is with continuing frustration that the government have not acknowledged the impact this has had and will continue to have for schools for many years to come.

The money the Friends have raised in the past has provided our children with experiences and resources that our budget can simply not stretch to and we are so grateful. This year we are hoping to raise funds to build a sensory garden and purchase a new smart screen for the hall.

The Friends are always looking for new members to join the elected committee (this is required to maintain their registered charity status) and the elections are held every year at the AGM (more details to follow) but 'every little helps' and you may be able to support in other ways at the organised events simply by attending the events we put on, baking or offering half an hour of your time to sell drinks or sweets etc.

During drop off and pick up we operate a one way system at the front of school to avoid congestion. Please use the ramp to enter the play-ground and the steps to exit (continue to use the ramp to exit if you have a pushchair, require a wheelchair or have other mobility difficulties).

FIRST AID.



As we all know, bumps, bruises and grazes are part of any child's life and if your child has a knock or a fall at school they may receive first aid. When this happens, and it is a minor injury, a first aid form will be completed at school and sent home with your child at the end of the school day. If we feel the injury is more serious, we will contact you immediately and ask you to arrange to seek professional medical help. Likewise, we request that if your child sustains any injuries outside of school hours to notify your class teacher via class dojo. We may also contacted you if we observe a bump, bruise or graze that we believe has not occurred whilst in school and ask you to verify the injury occurred at home and to establish if your child requires any further first aid throughout the school day
